LARRY ACHEATEL'S RESPONSE TO BEING HONORED AT THE EVERY CHILD CAMPAIGN PRESIDENTS' DINNER – DECEMBER 6, 2009

In his book, Good to Great and the Social Sectors, Jim Collins wrote:

"Do whatever you can to get the right people on the bus, the wrong people off the bus, and the right people into the right seats.... **Greatness** flows first and foremost from having the right people in the <u>key</u> seats, not the other way around." "**Greatness** flows first and foremost from having the right people in the key seats, not the other way around."

Jim Collins is so right.
